Hi. I'm Alfonso. I found the Mission by accident, and it was one of the best accidents ever!



a few times, and I

can't do it again."

Hi, I'm Ruben. After a tough year, I'm working toward building stability with caring Mission staff members.

My single mom and 6 kids moved a lot in my youth. I couldn't focus well in school, and became kind of a class clown. At 20 I moved to

Oklahoma, but had relationship trouble. For seven years I moved back and forth from Idaho to Oklahoma.

After we broke up, I tried California with a person who turned angry. Back to Oklahoma City I went, then to Tulsa. I worked low wage jobs, found and lost apartments, stayed in shelters, and even slept on the street. I transferred to upstate New York, then tried Boston. It's so tiring to move all the time!
