Hello. Carlos here. Before the Boston Rescue Mission, I had nowhere to go and didn't know what to do next. Here, little by little, my life is falling into place.

Growing up, I felt like a simple child with simple needs. After graduation, I started drinking and hanging out with the guys on the weekends. After awhile, I neglected my house and family, the bills piled up, and my wife and I separated.


At one point, I noticed a serious amount of hip pain. Without a diagnosis or doctor help, I

began self-medicating with heroin. After operations on both hips, I drank a lot, and became homeless for about a year. I finally had enough of feeling terrible, and the Mission offered me a place to stay.

We all have challenges, but everyone tries here, and a great support system helps us out. It takes some time, but God has me here for a reason, and I keep giving God thanks.


## Women's Shelter Program Extended

Last October, the Mission started hosting overnight accommodations for 60 women at the downtown headquarters to meet increased demand. Every evening the women get a hot meal, a warm, safe place to sleep, and breakfast in the morning. Recently the Mission was able to extend 45 of the beds for women through the end of June. John Samaan, President of the Mission stated that "Regardless of the season, it is important for the Mission offer shelter to these vulnerable homeless women."

Hi, I'm Tommy. At the Mission, the staff help to make sure I'm doing the job of recovery properly. It's a good thing, considering the mess I've been through.

On school vacations I worked for my dad's company. I smoked weed, but not seriously at first. At 24, I got into some harder drugs after connecting with guys at a jail. Odd jobs and money dwindled away. With drug



addiction comes life on the streets. For me, that meant a repeat cycle of jail, release, work, money, and drugs. After years of abuse, everything caught up with me.

The Mission's structured environment helps me in so many ways. On-site nurses help me heal my body. The counseling is great, especially the spiritual work. Every

day I'm grateful to have a roof and a bed.

When the drug lifestyle caught up to me, I'm glad the Mission was here to rescue me!
